ARZENU: A Vote for Progress in Israel: what comes next

Last month, you heard from Rabbi Dean Shapiro of Beth Shalom, Auckland, who outlined the campaign currently underway to elect a New Zealand representative to the World Zionist Congress, and why this election is so important.

To recap: The World Zionist Congress (WZC) is a gathering through which Diaspora Jews can influence certain policies for Israel and world Jewry. Every five years, the WZC votes on the disbursement of over \$US1.5 billion, and the number of delegates determines the direction of this spending – it's a big deal!

We can help to ensure that this spending goes to Progressive causes by electing a Progressive delegate to the WZC, who will fly to Israel to vote on behalf of New Zealand Jewry.

The Progressive slate for the WZC, ARZENU, believes in:

- · A strong, secure, democratic and Jewish Israel, as envisioned in its Declaration of Independence;
- \cdot Israel's right to exist as a Jewish state and defend its people from terror. ARZENU opposes efforts to delegitimize this right;
- \cdot Religious equality where all Jewish traditions and forms of observance are respected, with full recognition of liberal Movements and an end to the ultra-Orthodox monopoly as the recognised religious authority;
- · Regional security through peace and stability for Israel, Palestinians, and neighbours;
- · Full equality under the law for all Israelis, including minorities, women, and LGBTQ+ people; and
- \cdot A secure Israel alongside a peaceful Palestinian state being vital for stability.

Please register now! Once you are registered, you will receive a link to vote when voting opens. A few points:

- If you are an Israeli citizen and voted in the Israeli Parliamentary elections in 2022, you are not eligible to vote (sorry)
- Registration costs \$3, which is a great investment in Israel's future, but please reach out if this is a barrier for you every vote counts!
- Voting is a two step process:
- o Register (between 28 April and 30 May 2025); once registered, you'll be sent a link to....
- o Vote in the election (between 15 June and 30 June 2025).

AUCKLAND JEWISH BURIAL AND BENEVOLENT SOCIETY

The Burial and Benevolent Society held its Annual General Meeting in person and online on 30 March 2025.

The following members were elected to the management committee unopposed: Jack Wilton (President), David Zussman (Vice-President), David Singer (Treasurer), Sue Pezaro (Secretary) Stephanie Markson, Sonja Karon, Julie Dick and Haim Ainsworth.

Sonja Karon gave a review of training undertaken during the past year and Rabbi Dean spoke to the meeting on the Jewish view of organ donation which is now viewed as a life saving mitzvah. David Zussman then presented his annual report as Vice President and Jack Wilton presented the Treasurer's report.

The meeting unanimously accepted the proposed revised constitution and passed two motions related to membership unanimously. As a result, family membership now includes any child under the age of 21 at no additional charge.

Family members up until age 30 are included in family membership whether or not they are resident in the same home, provided they usually reside in Aotearoa/New Zealand and medically and legally dependent children are included regardless of age. The fee for additional members aged 21-30 is \$20 per person.



From 1 April 2025 all new individual or family memberships will be subject to a one-off administration fee of \$100 on joining and will then be entitled to taharah and the conduct of a funeral service without charge.

"A Jewish family caught in the Crosshairs of History" - a talk by Claire Bruell

When Claire's father died in 1979 he left, amongst his documents, a piece of paper with a thin line showing six people. From one of them was a further line to a person called Frank Briess. Frank was her father.

The four books that Claire has written largely deal with her exploration of the questions this drawing raised: Who were these people, where were they and what happened to them? The resulting books are Claire's answers to these questions, exploring the lives of her ancestors in the towns, villages and cities of Moravia and Galicia over the last 250 years. They represent how Claire placed her family's history within the context of its time and place. This is the story of one extended family and how that family intersected with history. At the same time the histories will touch on shared experiences of others in the group.

Claire will share with us how the books came to be, describing her wonderful collaboration with Mike Regan. She will describe some of the stories within the stories.

The books will not be published or sold but were written for her grandchildren. You will have the opportunity to see these books.


Shlichei Tzibor Training Program


